#### **Prevention**

### Section 4. First aid measures

#### Description of necessary first aid measures

**Eye contact**

Inhalation

: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. #### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

Large spill

## Appropriate engineering controls
